### Event Information

Teams: Open (18+)

- A team may play with no fewer than five (5) players.
- Men
  - DIVISION I
  - DIVISION II
- Women
- Co-ed
  - For co-ed teams, 3 men & 3 women must be on the court during play.
  - If a team plays with five (5) players then three (3) of those five (5) must be female.

Doubles:

- Men's Doubles:
  - 18 +, 30+, 40 + & 50+
- Women's Doubles:

- Open (18+)

**A competitor may enter both the 6-Person Team and the Co-Ed Team events.**

Active competitors from police, fire and eligible first responder agencies may combine to form a team regardless of agency size **WITHIN A COUNTRY**.

Retired competitors may combine to form a team in any manner they wish with other eligible competitors whether police or fire. This includes cross country lines.

**Officials**

A minimum of one FIVB (or national/state affiliate) certified official will be present at each site during the tournament.

Two certified officials will officiate all medal round matches.

**Medical**

Basic medical supplies will be available at the venue.

Communications shall be available at each venue and preparations made in case it is necessary to summon emergency services.

**Sporting Equipment**

Each team is responsible for bringing their own practice balls

All competitors must wear a team uniform. Uniform shirts must be numbered and identical in color. Each team must have two different colored uniform shirts available. Uniforms must meet FIVB & WPFPG Requirements.

## Competition Format

Matches will be the best two (2) out of three (3) games played to twenty-five (25) by rally scoring. Game three (3) will only go to fifteen (15).

Championship match of the playoffs will be best three (3) out of five (5).

Substitutions may be made anytime the ball is not in play, but must stay in rotation.

### **Bracketing**

Men's and Women's Doubles: Double Elimination.

6-Person Team (Divisions I & II), "Women", and Co-Ed Team: Each event will begin with Round Robin (Group Play). The Round Robin will be followed by Single Elimination finals in each event. Teams will be assigned to pools, observing seeding from prior WPFPG. The size of the pools is determined by the number of teams in the tournament and the number of courts available. If there are 7 or less teams in an event, Group Play alone will determine the winners.

### **Scheduling**

### **Awards**

Medals are awarded First through Third Place (1st – 3rd).

## **Sport Rules**

### GENERAL SPORT RULES for Volleyball - Indoor

Driven balls, unlimited touch/hit, referee decision.

No open hand 'dinks' for Men's and Women's Doubles

Three hits off a block.

In Co-Ed, FIVB rules require that if there is more than one contact on a side, at least one of these contacts must be by a woman.

In Co-Ed, positional rotation is optional, except servers must rotate.

Unlimited substitution between players for co-ed teams only.

Uniforms as required by FIVB & WPFPG Rules.

Late Teams; Penalty: If a team is not ready to compete 15 minutes after the scheduled starting time they forfeit the first game. After an additional 10 minutes have elapsed they forfeit the match.

The Sport Coordinator shall prepare a guide that contains event dates, times, locations, court assignments, scoring format, assigned referees and scorers, rules and appropriate notes.

A team captains'/coaches meeting should ideally be held the day or night before the first competition, or if this is not possible, the morning of the first day's competition to allow for distribution of this guide to the team captains and discussion and clarification of rules.

A competitor may enter both the 6-Person Team and the Co-Ed Team events.

### **Pre Competition Meeting**

Prior to the start of competition, a meeting will be held between the referees and the captain or coach from each participating team to clarify rules and conduct of play. Details of this meeting will be shared in the Sport Confirmation Letter.

### **Players Conduct**

Any serious violation of conduct, such as fighting or violence toward players or officials will result in the player(s) immediate ejection from that game and his/her automatic suspension from his/her team's next scheduled game. The sport coordinator shall immediately notify the WPFPG, who will investigate each incident to determine if additional discipline will be imposed.
