Welcome to the United States Police & Fire Championships. This letter serves as your Final Confirmation of your participation in Rifle-Air. Rifle-Air is scheduled for Tuesday, June 3rd at the West lawn at the Marriott Mission Valley, 8757 Rio San Diego Dr, San Diego, CA 92108. The Guiding Bodies are the United States Police & Fire Championships, International Shooting Sport Federation, and National Rifle Association Rules.

Conduct Expected of ALL Participants:

Drinking of alcoholic beverages, unlawful consumption of controlled substances, and gambling is prohibited while competing. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be condoned either before, during, or after competition. Any physical or verbal assaults on officials, competitors, spectators, coordinators or ex-officios will be met **with IMMEDIATE AND SEVERE PENALTIES**, including **EXPULSION** from these and future United States Police & Fire Championships.

Registration:

Each athlete must go in person to the Accreditation Center located at the Marriott Mission Valley, 8757 Rio San Diego Dr, San Diego, CA 92108 prior to their events. **AGENCY IDENTIFICATION REQUIRED.**

Each competitor **MUST** check in at the venue before competing. Each competitor **MUST** show their Participation Pass and Agency ID. A competitor not showing both items will **NOT** be able to participate. Competition will **NOT** be delayed or rescheduled if the competitor does not have his/her Accreditation.

Important:

It is the Team Captain's responsibility to notify their team of all requirements, including Registration and Venue Check-in procedures. Captains must immediately contact the Sport Coordinator if there are any errors in the participant information.

All team players must submit an entry and pay sports fees. Any changes in **DULY ENTERED PLAYERS**, such as withdrawals and/or substitutions, and any additions to the team that are **NOT** reflected in a previously submitted Team Roster **MUST** be made known by submission of a **DATED, REVISED** team roster.

Equipment:

All equipment and ammunition will be supplied by the competitor and shall be inspected and approved prior to competition.

Firearms:

Any Air Rifle using compressed air of CO₂, caliber 4.5mm (.177 cal). The weight of the rifle with sights may not exceed 5.5 Kg (12.2 lbs.). The total overall length of the air rifle may not exceed 850 mm.

Ammunition:

Any type or form of 4.5 mm (.177 cal) projectile that is made of lead or similar soft material. Steel projectiles are prohibited. Ammunition will **NOT** be available at the venue.

Shooters must use only equipment and apparel that complies with the ISSF Rules. Anything (guns, devices, equipment, accessories, etc.) which may give a shooter an unfair advantage over others, and which is not mentioned in these Rules, or which is contrary to the spirit of the ISSF Rules and Regulations, is prohibited. The shooter is responsible for submitting all equipment and apparel for official inspection and approval to a

USPFC Equipment Inspector prior to its use in USPFC competition. Team leaders are equally responsible for ensuring that the shooters' equipment and apparel comply with the ISSF Rules and Regulations.

Target Specifications:

NRA 10-meter AR-5/10

Course of Fire:

The 10-meter (33 feet) Air Rifle (Standing Position) will be used for these events. This course of fire will consist of 60 shots within 105 minutes, including sighters. A minimum of 4 sighting targets will be provided for each course of fire. A ten (10) minute preparation period will be followed immediately by the course of fire. Shooting time, including sighting shots, is 105 minutes.
